

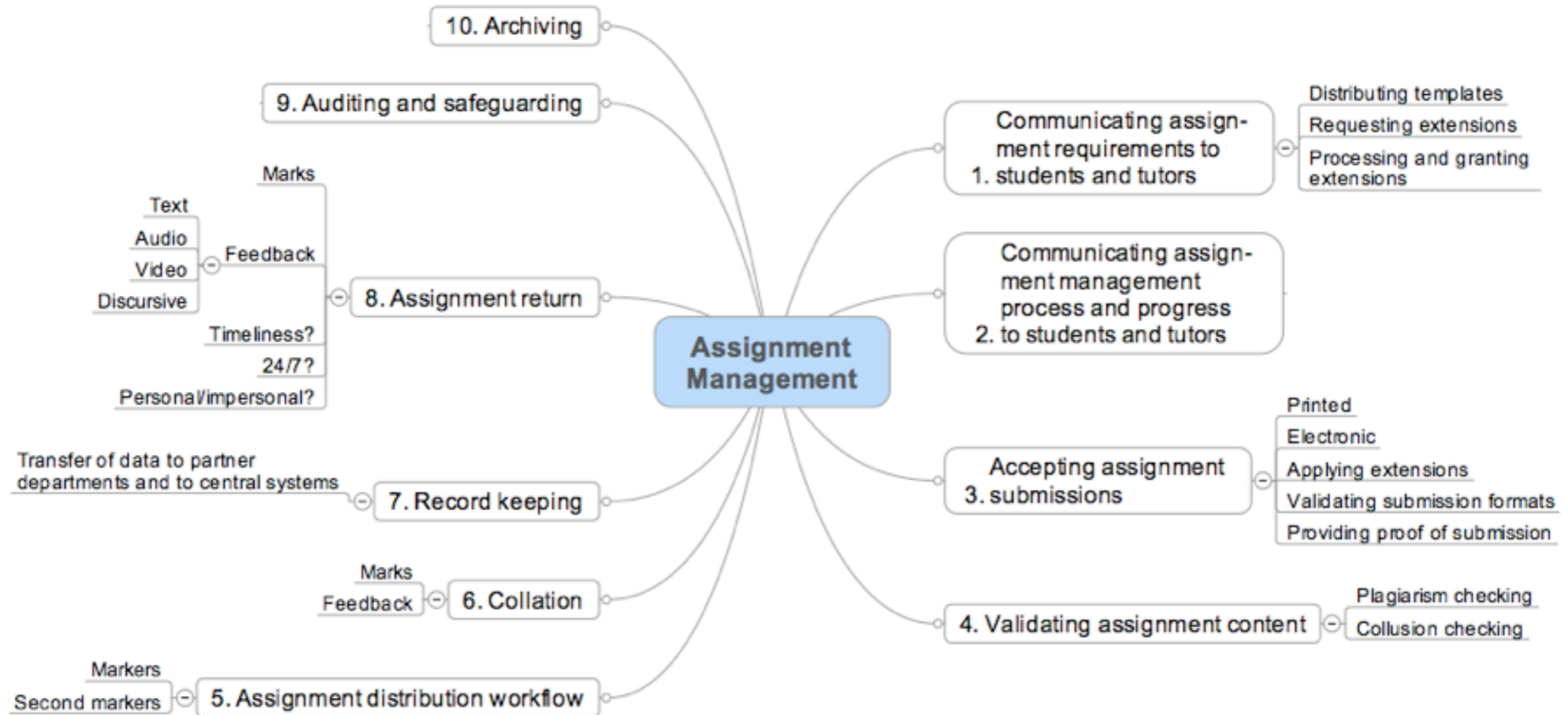

- * speed.

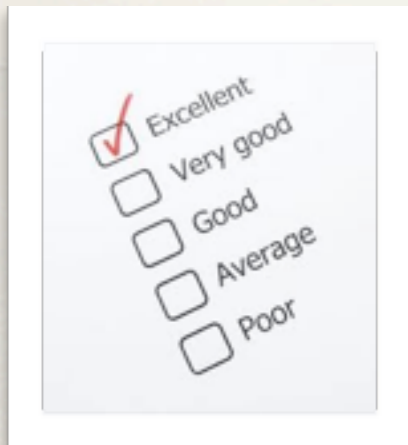
